Elizabeth Casson Memorial Lecture

The lecture is a memorial to Dr Elizabeth Casson (1881-1954) in honour of her contributions to the occupational therapy profession. The first woman to be awarded the degree of Doctor of Medicine at the University of Bristol in 1929, Dr Elizabeth Casson specialised in psychiatry and introduced occupational therapy to England, setting up the first school of occupational therapy, Dorset House, in Bristol.

The Casson lecture is an honour to be asked to give this year Keir Harding gave a thought provoking lecture called - Nothing grows in toxic environments, if you missed it you can catch up Here

Registering with the Health Care Professions Council (HCPC)

Once you have finished your degree to use the title occupational therapist you must apply to go the the HCPC register, this need updating every 2 years, as part of the process of registering you must sign to say you are fit to practice, but if you have a health condition or disability what does this mean?
