This workshop, co-organised by the Royal College of Occupational Therapists (RCOT) and Rachel Booth-Gardiner from AbleOTUK, is designed to advance ongoing discussions from RCOT's UK-wide leadership forum and the England advisory group for the Workforce Strategy. The goal is to help the occupational therapy (OT) workforce articulate its value and contribution in both inpatient (acute) and community services, addressing the full spectrum of life and diverse needs, including physical, mental, emotional, psychological, and social aspects.
