"Collaborating for Accessibility: AbleOTUK's Input on the New RCOTWebsite"

In a recent meeting with RCOT staff, AbleOTUK members, including those from Expert Advisory Groups, provided valuable feedback on developing RCOT's new website. Discussions centred on enhancing accessibility, usability, and inclusivity, particularly for individuals with disabilities. Members shared their lived experiences, highlighting challenges with Access to Work support and the need for improved digital accessibility. RCOT outlined plans for features such as dark mode, better navigation, and a dedicated accessibility page. They also committed to ongoing user testing and accessibility improvements to create a more inclusive platform for all users, including nonmembers.
